

Laura Brandt, Voice



Laura Brandt has been hailed as a "tour-de-force" and a "powerhouse soprano". She is a frequent performer with Calgary Opera in mainstage roles, summer festivals, school tours and donor events. Credits there include Frasquita (Carmen), Aurore (Le Portrait de Manon), Gretel (Hansel and Gretel), and Female Chorus (The Rape of Lucretia). As an ambassador for Calgary Opera, she has been a soloist on two European river cruises, travelling and singing from Budapest to Amsterdam. Recently Laura made a foray into musical theatre with forty performances as Lily in Theatre Calgary's production of The Secret Garden. Laura has been featured as a soloist with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra (Music of the Movies, Pops, and outreach concerts), The Festival Chorus (Elijah, Brahms Requiem), Spiritus Chamber Choir (Resphighi Laud to the Nativity), The Mountain View Chamber Festival, The Calgary Civic Symphony (Popera, Mahler 2), The Newfoundland Symphony

Orchestra, Opera on the Avalon (Governess, The Turn of the Screw), Opera New Brunswick, and Cowtown Opera (Rosalinde, Die Fledermaus). Laura has a B.Mus. from Mount Allison University and an M.Mus. in vocal performance from the New England Conservatory. At NEC she sang Donna Anna (Don Giovanni), First Lady (The Magic Flute), and the Sprechstimme for Pierrot Lunaire. She teaches voice and piano in Calgary. In her free time Laura enjoys getting outdoors with her husband and three-year-old, hiking, running, and enjoying the mountains. www.laurabrandt.ca

Tory Doctor, Musical Theatre

Tory Doctor's career spans almost 30 years in over 60 productions throughout 40 countries. Select credits include The Secret Garden, Cats, Legends, Beauty and the Beast, Blood Brothers, Me and My Girl, Man of La Mancha, Grease, Evita, Anne of Green Gables, Jeremy de Bergerac, Austentacious, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Damn Yankees, My Fair Lady, Guys and Dolls, A Christmas Carol, Cyrano de Bergerac and Married Alive (with Three's Company's Joyce DeWitt). Tory has also worked with the world's largest producers of musicals, Disney and Cameron Macintosh.

Mr. Doctor has been teaching acting, musical theatre, private lessons, and specialized workshops for the past two decades. He has been a guest speaker for numerous colleges and Universities across North America, focusing on bridging the gap between Community theatre and the professional world. He is also an



accomplished writer having written four musicals with his writing partners, Dave Zabriskie and Nico Rhodes.

Nico and Tory are currently working on their latest musical "Off the Beaten Path". A surprisingly touching irreverent multi-platform musical that pays homage to all the fantasy franchises that preceded it. From Harry Potter and The Witcher to Dungeons and Dragons and Choose Your Own Adventure, Off the Beaten Path is a musical that encompasses them all.

Magdalena von Eccher, Piano



Magdalena von Eccher is recognized as one of Canada's finest musicians. Her performances as solo pianist, with orchestra, collaborating with singers, and in chamber music are earning the highest praise from fellow musicians and are loved by audiences. Magdalena's musical communication is always personal, poetic, and of the highest artistic calibre. Along with her performing career she is an enthusiastic and engaging teacher and adjudicator, having been on faculty at the University of Lethbridge Department of Music and at McGill University's Schulich School of Music. She is now based in Charlottetown, PEI having joined the faculty at the University of Prince Edward Island as Assistant Professor of Piano.

Success in numerous competitions, including the Knigge, Bösendorfer, Canadian Music Competition and winning the National Music Festival (2006), alongside extensive studies, have well prepared Magdalena for a blossoming

career. She completed music degrees at University of Lethbridge, the University of British Columbia, and McGill University under the guidance of distinguished Canadian pianists, Glen Montgomery, Jane Coop, and Stéphane Lemelin. Having an affinity for vocal repertoire, Magdalena has studied with esteemed collaborative artists Michael McMahon (McGill University) and Rena Sharon (UBC). Participation in summer programs at Orford, Vienna, Salzburg, as well as a residency at the Banff Centre were generously supported through scholarships from her respective universities, the Strauss Foundation, and the Alberta Foundation for the Arts.

Since 2007, Magdalena has enjoyed invitations to the Festival of the Sound in solo performances as well as in collaboration with artists such as the festival's director, James Campbell, Denis Brott, Cameron Crozman, Marion Newman, James Somerville, and visual artist, Alan Stein. Recipient of the prestigious Joseph-Armand Bombardier Graduate Scholarship from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, Magdalena's doctoral research project focused on the late Piano Sonatas of Jewish composer, Viktor Ullmann. http://www.magdalenavoneccher.com

Nancy Dahn, Strings



For over twenty years, violinist Nancy Dahn, University Research Professor, and fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, has built an international career in the acclaimed Canadian chamber ensemble Duo Concertante with pianist Timothy Steeves. After their first concert in 1997, the Halifax Chronicle-Herald called them "two packages of musical dynamite that would credit any stage on the planet." Since then, their over 600 performances at such venues as Carnegie Hall, Wigmore Hall, Roy Thompson Hall, and Shanghai City Theatre have become recognized internationally as passionate, subtle, and brilliant, and praised for "artistry, poetry, and impeccable technique" (La Scena Musicale) in "deeply integrated performances that flow naturally as if the music were being created on the spot" (Gramophone).

Her twelve acclaimed Duo recordings include the complete Beethoven sonatas which received critical praise in German, Austrian, British and Canadian media

and is featured almost weekly on CBC, and the 2017 ECMA winner J.S. Bach Sonatas for Violin and Keyboard. Of the Beethoven recording, Gramophone writes that Dahn and Steeves "do Atlantic Canada proud in this splendid new set" and refers to a "miracle of... knowledge and poetry." Their recording of Murray Schafer's Duo for Violin and Piano, which he composed for them, won the 2011 Juno Award for Classical Composition of the Year.

Passionate advocates for new music, Dahn has created a legacy through a relentless commissioning program, inspiring a total of 66 new works and original arrangements for violin and piano from Canada's leading composers. The Duo's CDs Wild Honey, Wild Bird and Incarnation consist entirely of commissioned Canadian works. CBC picked Incarnation as one of the top ten classical recordings of 2017; it also won the 2018 ECMA for Classical Recording of the Year. The Duo's Christmas album Perfect Light won the ECMA for Classical Recording of the Year in 2019.

Her commitment to working with young musicians gave rise to the annual Tuckamore Chamber Music Festival, which the Duo founded in 2000. In addition to presenting world-renowned guest artists alongside emerging and well-known local talents, the festival offers an inspiring and intensive educational experience for over 20 young chamber musicians and composers. Through this chamber music festival, the Duo has introduced the highest musical standards to the province, developed free enrichment, outreach, and school touring programs and recruited excellent students to Memorial's graduate programs.

Throughout her years of artistic endeavors and achievements, Nancy Dahn has maintained a select studio of over 15 violinists at Memorial University. Hired in 1995 with only one string student enrolled at the university, Dahn now draws students from across North America; some have pursued graduate studies at such institutions as The Juilliard School and Manhattan School. She regularly gives masterclasses across Canada, the US and abroad.

Duo Concertante's artistic excellence and contributions throughout their 20-year career extend beyond superb musicianship in live performances and recordings to an intense commitment to reaching audiences, passionate advocacy for new music and a deep dedication to mentorship. She also curates and develops extra musical projects which focus on issues surrounding environment, social justice, and history. In these regards, primarily through her work in the acclaimed ensemble Duo Concertante, Nancy has demonstrated an exceptional level of achievement as a researcher/performer, teacher, and community leader.

Dylan Rook Maddix, Brass

Dylan Rook Maddix is Professor of Music at Cambrian College in Sudbury, ON, where he conducts the wind ensemble, teaches music theory, and serves as the head of wind and brass studies. He also serves on the faculty of Laurentian University where of teaches conducting. Dylan is founder of the Toronto Winds, host of The Band Room Podcast, and maintains an active career as a sought-after conductor, clinician, performer, and adjudicator across Canada.

With a passion for music education and outreach, Dylan maintains a commitment to working with young people and the community. He has been music director of the Milton Concert Band, a conducting fellow with the Denis Wick Canadian Wind Orchestra, program assistant of the Hannaford Youth Program, and is now co-manager of the Denis Wick Canadian Wind Orchestra. Dylan has conducted the Northern Ontario Honour Band, Halifax Community Band Festival, Royal Conservatory Brass Ensemble, Northdale Concert Band,



Western University New Music, Hannaford Youth Band, Mount Allison University Symphonic Band, Kingston Brass Choir, and Bathurst Chamber Festival Orchestra.

A prizewinner at the 2011 & 2014 National Music Festivals, Dylan has been a featured soloist with the Prince Edward Island Symphony, Weston Silver Band, Greater Moncton Chorale and Orchestra, and Strathgartney Chamber Orchestra. His musicality has led him to numerous festivals in Canada and the United States including the Scotia Festival of Music, Charlottetown Festival, North American Brass Band Championships, Indian River Music Festival, Bathurst Chamber Music Festival, Music Fest Canada, and the Luminato Festival. He holds a Master of Music from the University of Toronto and a Bachelor of Music from Mount Allison University.

Morgan Saulnier, Woodwinds



Morgan Saulnier is a collaborative pianist for the Holland College School of Performing Arts, audition and rehearsal pianist for the Charlottetown Festival and Confederation Centre of the Arts, and a member of The Piano Collective (piano, 8 hands). She is principal flute in the PEI Symphony Orchestra and flute instructor at UPEI.

Morgan Saulnier holds a Masters in Music Performance from Memorial University and a Bachelor of Music from the University of Prince Edward Island, where she studied both flute and piano. Ms. Saulnier has participated in coachings from some of the world's most celebrated pianists, Anton Kuerti and Janina Fialkowska. Ms. Saulnier is in high demand as a flute and piano educator, soloist, and collaborator.

Saulnier brings her extensive experience as an accompanist and coach to her adjudications. Each year she participates in hundreds of hours of coaching and instruction. She also brings her own experiences as a young competitor. As a student, she competed extensively in local, provincial, and national competitions, receiving numerous awards including RCM Silver Medals, various Rosebowls, and concerto competitions. She has a deep respect for the work and commitment that students, parents, and instructors put into preparing for the music festival.

Ms. Saulnier lives in Charlottetown with her husband and daughter, where she continues her own professional development and creative pursuits, recently recording an album entitled 'French Flute Music', as well as developing a fashion boutique that she owns on Victoria Row.


